## HOW IT WORKS

### Pick Your Location

- Select any local waterway or a park in your town that needs a clean-up.
- If you don't have a suitable waterway, a park is perfectly fine!

### Get Permission

- Be sure to secure the proper permissions needed to conduct a clean-up at your chosen site.

### Clean Up Your Weekend!

- Head out on your selected weekend and collect trash following the Guide to Safe Scouting.

## TRACK YOUR IMPACT

### Units should record:

- Who participated
- Total hours served
- Weight of all plastic trash (combined)
- Weight of all non-plastic trash (combined)
- Submit through our District Google Form.

Please provide a unit contact with email and phone so we can help supply gloves and trash bags.

## RECOGNITION

- All registered youth and adults earn a patch!
  - We are exploring Unit Ribbons as an added option. (TBD)
- Units may also enter this as an event in Scoutbook. A how-to video is available if needed.

## COMMITMENT

- Cub Scouts: 1–2 hours
- Scouts BSA, Crews & Ships: 4 hours (or until the job is done!)

Troops are highly encouraged to partner with Packs, and Packs are encouraged to coordinate with their local Troops for a joint service experience.

No one should enter the water, nor use boats, canoes, kayaks, or any flotation device.
